Oral Presentations

The selected presenting authors are requested to upload their presentation (landscape format 16:9) on a USB drive or laptop and deliver it to the slide center (inside the plenary room) at least one hour before the beginning of the session. Each presentation should last no more than 7 minutes followed by 3 minutes of discussion.

Posters

All posters must have maximum dimensions of 120 x 150 cm (portrait format).

Curbside Consultations

These sessions encourage a spontaneous discussion of a difficult clinical case. The case is presented by a speaker who raises a few key questions. The case is not previously known by any of the discussants. The speaker's role is to ensure a lively conversation and cover the various approaches, as well as to involve the audience in the conversation.

The Debate Session

The purpose of the debate is to have an intense discussion on some of the most burning controversies related to a specific topic. The two sides of the debate will be defended by two leading experts in the field, and the discussion will be controlled by a moderator whose role is to ensure that all aspects of the debate are duly discussed, as well as to involve the audience in the conversation.

Abstract Book

All submitted abstracts, accepted as oral presentations or posters, and presented during the Conference, will be published under the terms of Frontiers in Lupus & Frontiers in Medicine Journals.
